Supporting Language & Literacy

30 Months: Follow Their Lead

Build a love for learning, language, and literacy by engaging in their interests. If they love vehicles, help them explore the topic with books, stories, play, and safe experiences. Following their lead strengthens your bond with them, helps them develop their own interests, and lets them be creative.



Family Meals Enjoy each other's company & avoid screen time during meals.

Simple Puzzles Name each piece as your child puts it in place.

Tips



Let your child turn the pages while reading a book.





Tell new stories based on the pictures in the book to keep vour child's attention. You don't have to read word for word.



Make Reading Fun! Read under a 'fort' with a light.

Common Language Milestones

Follows 2-step unrelated directions, e.g. "Give me the ball and go get your coat"

Uses 2–3-word phrases & over 50 words (total across all languages spoken)

Uses '-ing' verbs, e.g. eating or running & '-ed' verbs, e.g. looked or played

At least 50% of speech is understood by the caregiver

Uses words to get your attention, e.g. 'look'

Says their name when asked



Early Detection is Intervention

Your child is always learning! As a caregiver, you have an amazing opportunity to guide them on a path to success.



If you notice your child is having difficulties with a certain skill, isn't meeting multiple milestones, or if something just doesn't feel quite right, **talk with your child's healthcare provider.**

Tips to set you and your child up for success when speaking with their healthcare provider:
